and 3pm at the Piopio Cosmopolitan Club. Prize giving 5pm.
No animals will be accepted after 3pm.
The Animal Health Board (AHB) have the right to test all presented pigs, deer and critters for TB.
Single entry (One hunter per entry), fee \$45 must accompany entry form.
All animals must be wild and not farmed.
All animals must be presented clean gutted with nuts in and whole carcasses only.
All animals must be caught within the stated times of competition.
All animals must be caught by the person weighing in.
No trapping of boars and deer.
In the event of a tie, the first animal in each category weighed in collects the prize.

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All animals must be hanging at the time of prize giving.

No decomposing animals (must be edible) or badly mutilated animals will be accepted.

Judges have the right to reject animals and Ridgeline judges' decision is final.

"Prize winners must be present to collect prizes"
Major prize section (\$1000 cash prize and Hunters weighed animal section\$500) Excludes Kids

Major Prize section (\$1000 cash prize and history and prize section entries).

Kids Critter Category - Cash draw prize. All weighed-in entries go into the draw to win 1 of 5 \$100 cash prizes. One entry per child registration.
